Goals & Opportunities:

The dancers will learn steps in the soft shoe dances (reel, jig and slip jig) at their appropriate level. As they get more advanced, they will learn the hard shoe dances of jig and hornpipe and individual set dances. The dancers will also learn traditional group or ceili dances. There will be opportunities for dancers to perform and dance in competitions throughout the year.

Dance Class Requirements:

- Dancers can obtain information from the teachers about purchasing Irish dancing shoes. Dancing with socks or ballet slippers is permitted, but dancers are encouraged to wear soft shoes or gillies if they continue to dance after the first session.
- Dance attire should include athletic wear or clothes that allow free movement. DeNogla School of Irish Dancing gear is available- more info to come.
- Dancers under the age of 10 must be picked up by an adult from the dance studio door promptly at the end of class.
- A parent waiting area is available during class. Please do not distract the dancers.
- Dancers may bring water but should keep food and gum out of the dance studio.

About the Teachers:

Cathleen Jordan Rubin- Cathleen, a Glenside native, is an acclaimed Irish dancer who is known for her athletic and powerful step dance style. She started dancing at the age of 6 and competed internationally for nearly 18 years. Cathleen holds an impressive record in Irish dance competitions, having placed as a Top 3, Top 10 and Top 20 finalist for many years in Regional, National, and World Championship competitions. In 2005, Cathleen received her T.C.R.G. (official teaching license) from An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha, the Irish Dance governing body, headquartered in Dublin, Ireland.

A 2002 graduate from the University of Notre Dame, Cathleen performed at Notre Dame football half-time shows and other Notre Dame sporting events. As a young dancer, she performed at Radio City Music Hall and Carnegie Hall. Cathleen also spent some time developing Irish Dance classes with the cruise director on Norwegian Cruise Lines. She currently works as a television producer at Center City Film and Video.

Megan Hunt- As a young child, Megan was drawn to Irish music at Irish festivals she attended with her family in the Philadelphia area. Her parents enrolled her in Irish dancing lessons at the age of 5. As she grew, Megan's natural affinity to Irish music turned into her passion for Irish dancing. She danced for many years at a championship level, competing and winning high awards in many regional and national competitions. Megan has qualified and danced in the World Championships of Irish Dancing multiple times.

Megan has also performed with many acclaimed Irish musicians: Wolf Tones and Eileen Ivers, and danced at Radio City Music Hall, New Jersey Performing Arts Center, Tropicana Hotel, and on the Norwegian Cruise Lines. During a semester abroad at University College Dublin, Ireland, she studied Irish traditions and dancing. Megan has a B.S. from Fordham University and a M.Ed. from Arcadia University. Currently, she is an 8th grade science teacher in the Lower Merion School District. As a

T.C.R.G. certified instructor for the DeNogla School, Megan is able to merge her love of Irish dance with her enthusiasm for teaching children.
